Color Combinations

There are 2 primary color combinations. The best color combination should be chosen based on the context of the overall piece. The alternatiive color combinations are available if the logo needs to be placed on a secondary color or if the context of the piece calls for it.

Don't distort the wordmark.

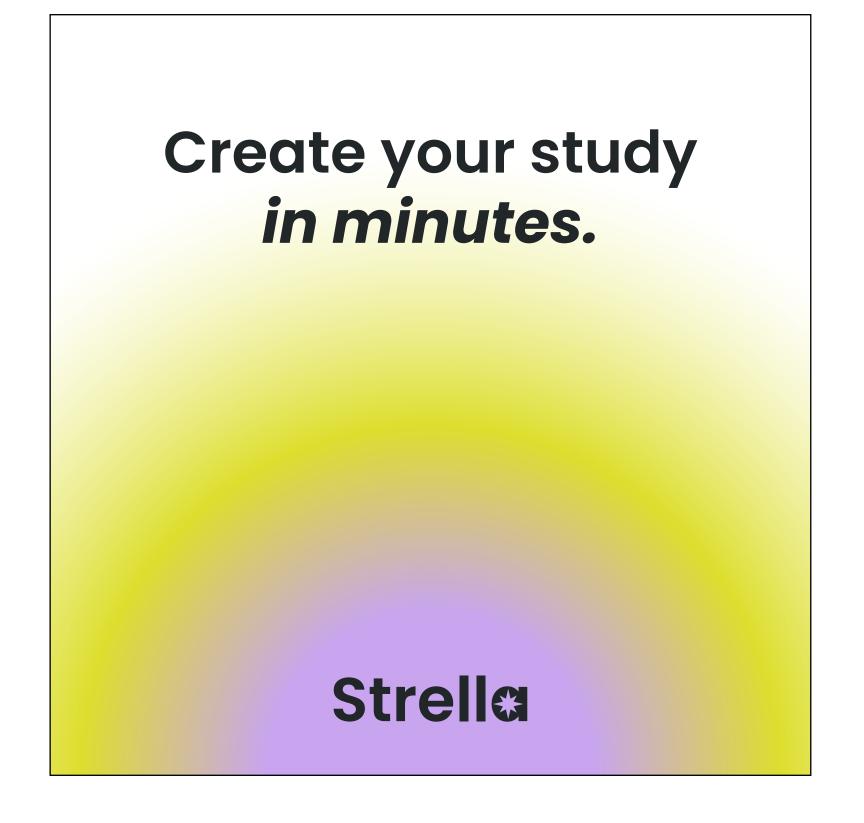

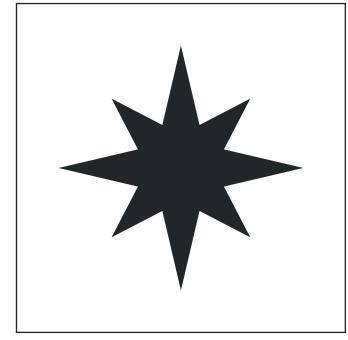


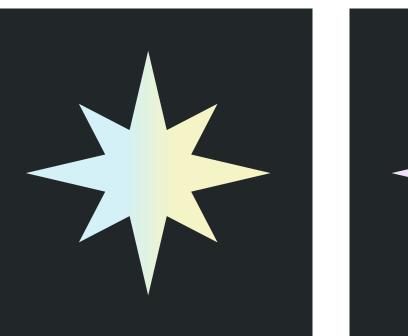
Color Combinations & Formats

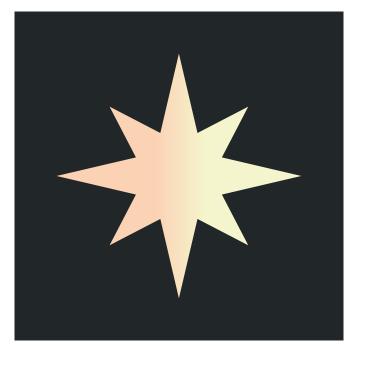
The color combination of the app icon will be the primary combination, but if necessary, these other color combinations may be used. Both square and circle formats are acceptable.

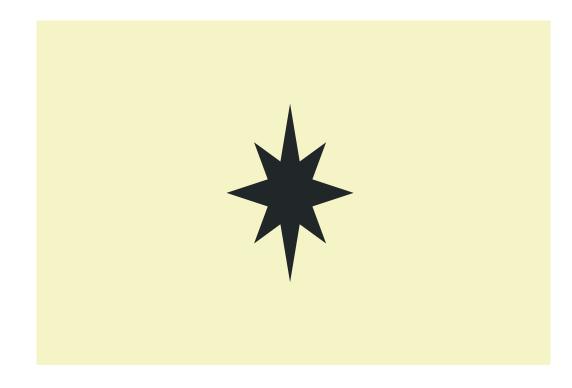
Don't place the symbol over backgrounds that lack sufficient contrast or hinder legibility.



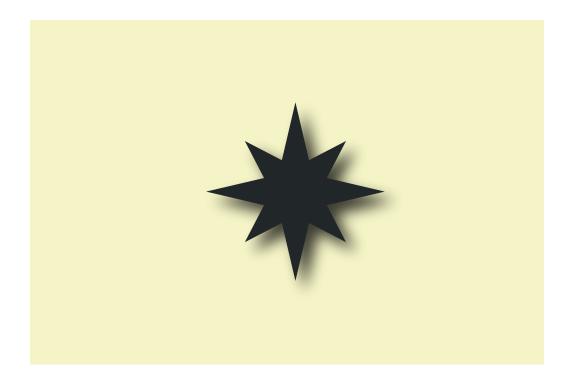

Primary Color Palette

This is the primary color palette. Soft Black and Infinite White should be the colors that are the foundation of the brand. The colors should be used as the base for most materials, as well as for icons, illustrations & CTA buttons.

Secondary Color Palette

These secondary colors can be used to bring in some color and add brightness or contrast where needed. They can be used as background colors and headline colors (on soft black). Use as you see fit, but keep in mind that these should not be overpowering the primary color palette.

Character Sets

Poppins should be used for headlines in the semibold weight. With a special branded headline, you can also emphasize a word or phrase using bold italic. Manrope should be used for all other copy in varying weights. Body copy should always be Manrope regular, where sub headers, breadcrumbs, CTA buttons, etc...can use different weights depending on the context.

Headlines

Standard Headlines

Standard headlines are what will be applicable in most contexts. This is a simple headline written in title capitalization and only use Poppins semibold font. This would apply to headlines in decks, one pagers, etc...

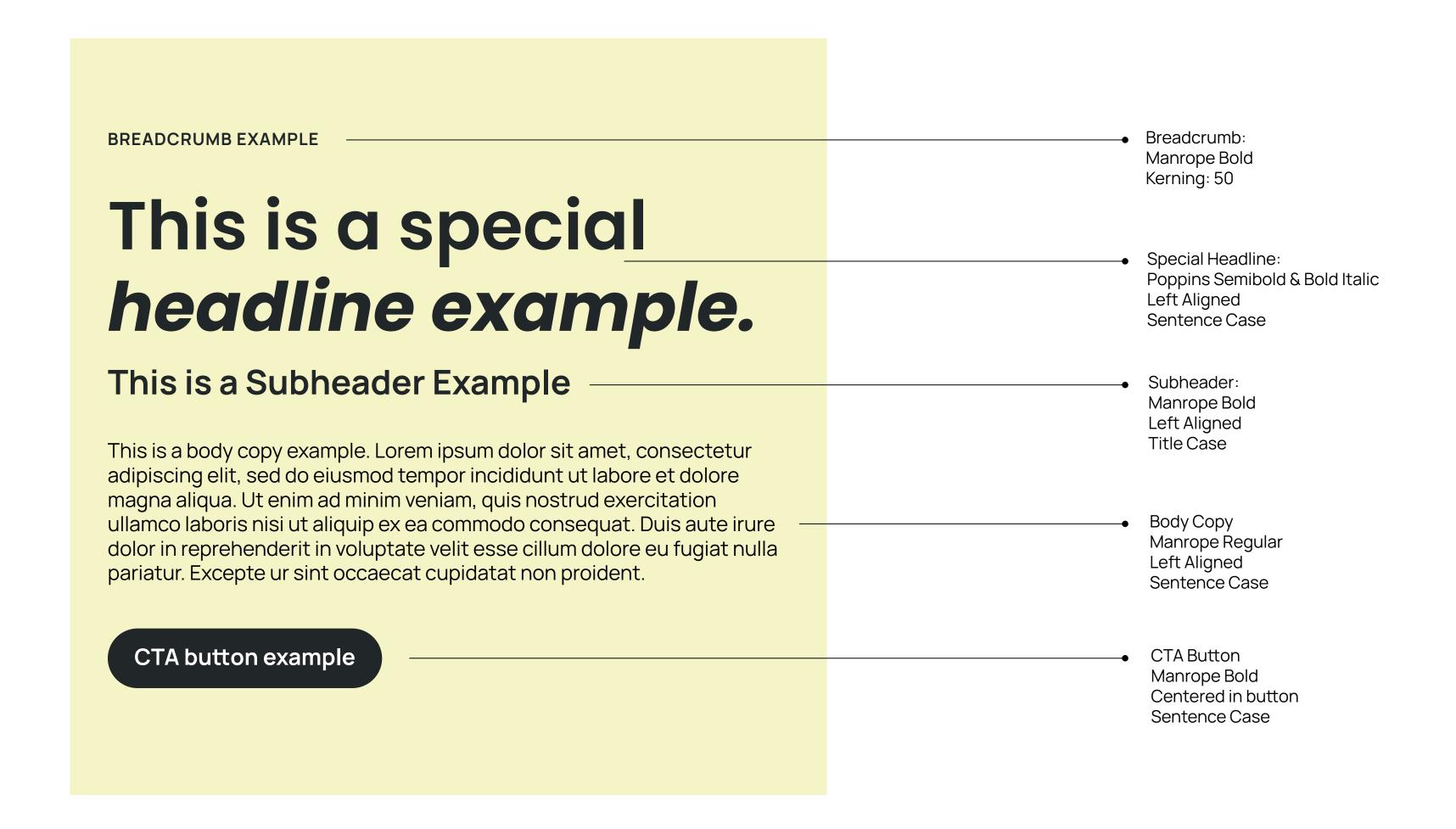
Special Headlines

Special headlines will be used when marketing the brand. This is a headline that is written in sentence case, uses both Poppins semibold and bold italic, and ends with punctuation. This would likely be used with very branded language, such as brand taglines. Special headlines may be used in very external facing contexts that are creating brand awareness, such as website, social, advertising, etc...
